- A. Aviation Security refers to security services and measures which are specific to the needs and requirements of the aviation industry.
- A. Aviation Safety is paramount because it ensures that air travel is safe for everyone including passengers, pilots, flight attendants, ground personnel and other people who work at or use the airport.

Small mistakes can have a disastrous consequence that is why it is vital for all those involved in air travel to be vigilant about following all regulations governing aviation safety.

- A. The International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) has put in place a list of Standards and Recommended Practices or SARPs for the aviation security to prevent and suppress all acts of unlawful interference in the industry.
- A. As a member of the ICAO, PNG is required to provide Aviation Security at all its security designated airports, in line with PNG's safety regulations which are adopted and administered by the Civil Aviation Safety Authority of PNG (CASA). The PNG Civil Aviation Rule Part 140, prescribes the requirements for providing aviation security services in PNG and it also prescribes the operating requirements for the continuation of this service.
- A. Only an organisation who meets all the requirements and is certified by CASA PNG is responsible for providing aviation security services.
- A. An aviation security service certificate may be granted or renewed for a period of up to five years and shall remain in force until it expires, suspended or revoked.
- · Aviation security services are provided;
- At security designated aerodromes
- · At security designated navigation installations
